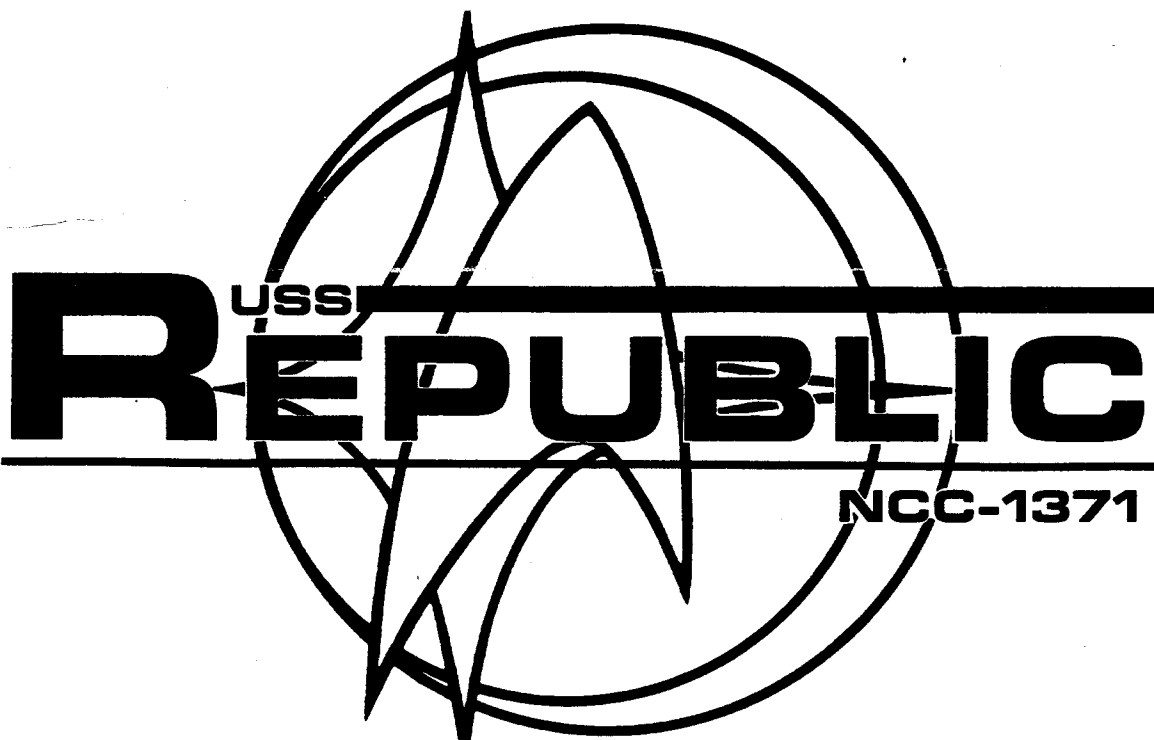

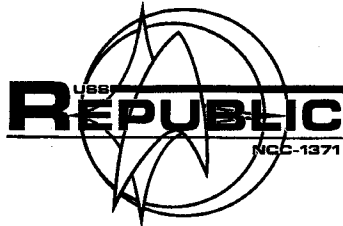

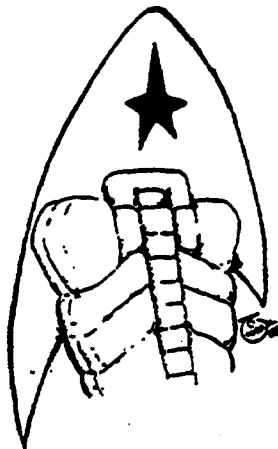

KEEPING AN EYE ON THE UNIVERSE

Newton, Einstein, and Everything

Introduction

Most people have no trouble dealing with the universe according to Isaac Newton. It is a wonderfully stable and predictable place, with laws of motion and gravity that are simplicity itself. People who have a basic grasp of science can understand Newtonian principles with ease: orbits move not in circles but in ellipses, for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction, bodies in motion tend to stay in motion, and gravity causes apples to fall from trees.

Mention Einstein and the dreaded word "relativity," however, and eyes begin to glaze

over and the attention span shortens. But Einstein's universe is not nearly as complex a place as it is sometimes made out to be. Part of the problem is simply semantics. Einstein called his concepts "theories of relativity"--special relativity (1905) deals with light and energy, and general relativity (1915) deals with gravity--but the great man himself preferred to think of his work as "invariance theory." What this means is that although observers may differ on how they perceive a phenomenon, the basic nature of the phenomenon is never in question even though it may be understood in different ways or reinterpreted depending on one's point of view.

I.

Einstein was the first to state that an observation is never objective; the results are relative depending upon the relationship between the observer and that which is observed. For example, our sun is a Type G, main-sequence yellow star. However, someone in a spaceship approaching our sun at an appreciable fraction of the speed of light would perceive it to be bluish (i.e., light waves are compressed in the direction of travel and shifted to a higher frequency). Conversely, someone in a spaceship leaving our sun at an appreciable fraction of the speed of light would perceive it to be reddish (i.e., light waves are lengthened in the direction of travel and shifted to a lower frequency). An observer approaching our sun and an observer leaving our sun, describing the same star, would obviously differ on what they saw. And both observers would be describing accurately what they saw. In either case, our home star has never changed its normal yellow hue at all. That is, the actual phenomenon--the yellow star--is "invariable."

The reverse of the above example is also true--an observer need not himself be in motion to experience the effects of relativity. The most famous example is the well-known one of a stationary person listening to the whistle of an approaching train. It is seemingly high in pitch (as the sound waves are compressed in the direction of the listener), and then it seems to fall abruptly as the train passes and recedes. This familiar demonstration of the Doppler effect vividly illustrates Einstein's contention that the universe is indeed invariable (i.e., the

actual pitch of the train whistle has never altered). What the universe looks like--or what the train whistle sounds like--is all "relative," depending upon one's point of view and relative velocity.

In Einstein's universe, "relative velocity" is the key. The results of either of the above examples would still be the same if the sun were moving toward (or away from) a stationary spaceship or if an observer were traveling at high speed toward (or away from) a stationary train that was blowing its whistle. And, of course, the color of the sun or the pitch of the whistle never really changes--the universe is invariable.

It was "special relativity" which showed how the universe could be infinitely expanding; the famous "red shifts" discovered in the light received from distant galaxies proved that they are receding from us and all other galaxies at high speeds. (And it does not matter that the distant galaxies are moving way

from us; the red shift would be just as evident were those galaxies stationary and we were in motion. As a matter of fact, we are both in motion--but that's beside the point.) It was also special relativity that provided Einstein with his frightening prescription for the explosive interchangeability of matter and energy, scrawled on the cover of every elementary science textbook, " $E = mc^2$." (However, where Einstein meant that matter and energy are merely equivalent, today's particle physicists believe that matter and energy are actually identical, a physical result anticipated by Einstein's theoretical work.)

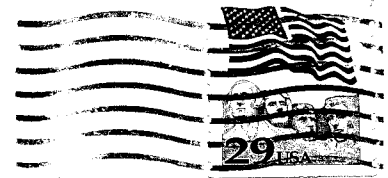
